CLASS PACKAGES AND FIELDS

The length of class packages has been changed as follows;

<u>Package</u>	<u>Old Length</u>	<u>New Length</u>
4 x class - £44	1 month	2 months
8 x class - £80	3 months	3 months – no change
10 x class - £90	3 months	4 months
12 x class - £100	3 months	6 months

The fields can be booked up to 3 months ahead. The booking system will be unlocked on the 1st of each month.

Training Tip

Going back a step during training. Sometimes for no apparent reason your dog will seem to lose certain obedience behaviour or positions. This is extremely common during the adolescence phase. It may be their focus, stays at a distance, recall or even their down.

The easiest way to solve this issue is to go back to basics, even if it means repeating some puppy style treat training. Do not worry, you should find the need to return to using treats is only a temporary measure to remind your dog of their previously learned behaviour. If it's any kind of distance issue, then reduce the distance and build their confidence back up slowly.

Recall issues can often be solved by going back to long line training or reinforcing recall in a low distraction environment before building up their distraction tolerance again. If the problem is positioning during off leash heelwork, then go back to on leash training to get that extra control necessary when shaping and polishing obedience positions.

We saw Blaze on the GSR South website in Dec 16. He was at their Gloucester kennels with their behaviourists as he had come to the rescue with many issues. He had spent the 1st year of his life cooped up in a flat with little socialisation.

His nickname at the kennels was Bitey Blaze as Sean can confirm!! After working with them for several months we took Blaze home at the end of July 2017. We initially fostered him to see if he settled and we formally adopted him in September 2017. Blaze lives with Bella an older female GSD from the same rescue who he loves and worships although she does put him in his place when needed and 2 mad budgies 'Little Bird' and Kevin. At home Blaze is almost a perfect dog, but he does bark at visitors and anyone going past the house. He doesn't like to be on his own and follows us around like our shadow. We were recommended by someone from the rescue about Sean and the secure dog fields after we were looking for a new trainer/behaviourist to help with his behavioural issues which was a deep set fear aggression.

He is known as a bit of a "Houdini" having gone through several collars and leads since we have had him. However he is walking better on the lead and I now have the confidence to walk both dogs together, until January this year they went out separately. His 'safe' distance has closed and he can cope with dogs running around chasing balls to a certain extent.

Our biggest achievement was when Sean invited us into the group class something we have not been able to do for the 3 years we have had him.

Whilst he isn't perfect and can sometimes struggle, he has taken the classes in his stride and we thoroughly enjoy them. We still continue to do weekly 121's with Blaze and Sean and the changes in Blaze have been amazing. Thank you Sean!
